Nancy Boutot

Nancy Boutot is the Manager of Financial Empowerment at National Disability Institute (NDI). Nancy is currently the Project Manager Lead, providing coordination and subject matter expertise regarding employment and benefits work supports. Prior to joining NDI, Nancy spent eight years with the Agency for Persons with Disabilities (APD) in Florida. Seven of those years were spent as a Regional Employment Coordinator where she managed the agency's five-year employment initiative to increase integrated employment options for individuals with developmental disabilities. Nancy's last year at APD was spent as the Employment Unit Chief, where she was responsible for the strategic plan for employment including development and implementation of "employment first" policy, practices and strategies that support career development and economic advancement. Prior to that, she spent fourteen years directing non-profit community based employment programs in both Florida and New Jersey. Nancy holds a BA degree from Northeastern University and a MS in Psychiatric Rehabilitation from the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey. She is also a certified Community Work Incentives Coordinator (CWIC) through Virginia Commonwealth University's National Training Center.

Shannon has lead two studies (two more are in process) with the Community Employment Alliance in Washington State regarding employment vendor/CRP cost of services. The results of the data were written as individual documents and are recognized by Washington State DDA (Developmental Disability Administration) and Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) as a tool in conversations regarding rate negotiation in both hourly and outcome based contracts. She has also partnered with two colleagues to write an article accepted into the Regent Moral Leadership Conference, 2013, on the subject of Moral Leadership: Executive Servant Leadership as a Means to Overcoming Organizational Resistance to Innovation.
